selling, & get a chance
to pay for the new Lot
in work. I will have enough
to build a better House
than the first one,

It is very handy for the Children
to attend School, & Church
here, & on the whole I think
I had better remain here for
the present.

The Papers of Earnest
Christian come regularly.

Our pleasant weather that
we have been having
along back is changed
to right cold freezing
weather, such as some
did not expect to see
again this Spring,

The sudden change
here is one of the greatest
objections to this latitude
however I do not know
but what it is as healthy
as any place I have lived
in.
