

Winnipeg, July 24th 1866.

Dear Brother

Your Letter of a recent date is received. I have been 40 miles from home the most of the time this summer, at work in a Town by the name of Owatonna where there is a good deal of building going on. It has been quite healthy so far this season in this locality. Crops are looking well but are somewhat later in maturing than last season. Barley & Oats will do to commence cutting in a week & Wheat in about 15 days. Corn looks well but will be late likewise. Wheat has been 1.60 but is now down again to 1.10 per Bushel. Religious matters are here as elsewhere at this season of the year, - at rather a low state. - Many turning their attention more to the cares of the present, than the future Life. Yet there are some

who apparently are alive. Two weeks
ago last Sabbath at Watonia the
Church was nearly half filled,
at prayer meeting. My religious interests
seemed to be starting up anew.

We are all in good health except
the children have the whooping cough.

May much of the comforting
influences of the Divine Spirit
be with you, in your old age, &
during the remainder of your
earthly pilgrimage journey, in the
sincere prayer
