

Worcester, Worcester Co. Minn.
Sept. 7th 1864.

Dear Brother,

Your Letter came duly to hand but being exceedingly busy I have neglected to write until now. Ware in comfortable health. I have been at work here the most of the Summer. Crops have been very good here this season. Wheat yielding from 15 to 40 bushels per Acre. Corn & Oats are good likewise. Wheat is now selling at 1.25 a good deal has already been thrashed & marketed.

Religious matters are rather at a low ebb. A Camp Meeting is in progress about 15 miles from here.

The Presbyterians are about commencing a new Meeting house here, as yet there is none of any order although we have Methodist, Baptist, Congregational, Presbyterian & Episcopal services regularly at the Hall & school room &c.

The Town is gradually building up & most likely will be a considerable place
