Dear Father,

Your letter came to hand some time since. I have been from home most of the summer & fall until within a few days past. We are all in comfortable health, and are having moderate winter weather.

The Papers of which you Inquire, come regularly; are read & appreciated. Religious matters are at rather a low ebb in this locality at present. Most likely there will be a warming up however before the winter is past as there will be some extra meetings before long. Wheat is now worth 45^{cts} Corn 40. Potatoes 50 Cts 30^{cts}. State still continues
Work on the R.R. from
Warren westward, is now being
done. Some are prophesying
an open Winter, but I think
we will catch it before
first of April: as we generally
do in this Locality. not
apt to be bothered much with
